Wh	hat was and what is Jesus still willing to do for us?	
1.	Jesus was willing to Himself for us.	
	When Jesus <i>came down</i> from the mountainside, large crowds followed Him. (1)	
	* He made Himself nothing by taking the very nature of a servant, He humbled Himself by becoming obedient (Philippians 2:7b-8)	
	* "For <u>I have come down</u> from heaven not to do My will but to do the will of Him who sent Me." (John 6:38)	
2.	Jesus is still willing to us.	
	A man with leprosy came and knelt down before Him and said, <i>"Lord, if You are willing, You can make me clean."</i> (2)	
	* This is the confidence we have in approaching God: that if we ask anything according to His will, He hears us . (1 John 5:14)	
	* You do not have because you do not <u>ask God</u> . (James 4:2e)	
3.	Jesus is still willing tous.	
	Jesus reached out His hand and touched the man. "I am willing," He said. " <i>Be clean!</i> " Immediately he was cleansed of his leprosy. (3)	
	* If we confess our sins, He is faithful and just and will forgive our sins and purify us from all unrighteousness . (1 John 1:9)	
	* Cleanse me and I will be clean I will be whiter than snow. (Psalm 51:7)	
4.	Jesus still wants to be through us.	
	Then Jesus said to him, "See that you don't tell anyone. But go, show yourself to the priest and offer the gift Moses commanded, as <i>a testimony to them</i> ." (4)	
	* So do not be ashamed of the testimony about our Lord (2 Timothy 1:8a)	
	* "In the same way, <u>let your light shine</u> before others, that they may see and glorify your Father in heaven." (Matthew 5:16)
